HISTORIC STRUCTURE



124 South Winter, Adrian

WHEREAS, historic structures are not only tangible evidence of important national history, but tell the stories of generations of citizens of Lenawee County and their triumph and tragedies as well; and

WHEREAS, the Lenawee Historical Society created its “Historic Structures” program to identify and celebrate places in Lenawee County, Michigan, that connect people to their individual and collective heritage, and to work toward creating an environment that will support the preservation and rehabilitation of historic buildings and neighborhoods, celebrate economic development of sites, and manage change in communities; and

WHEREAS, 124 South Winter Street is a fine example of a commercial Second Empire structure that dates to 1888; and

WHEREAS, the structure was erected by a bequest from the will of Elihu L. Clark for an Adrian Oddfellows Lodge; and

WHEREAS, Oddfellows has met on the second floor for over 100 years during which time a series of retail and service businesses, including tobacco and candy shops, a medical supply store, a paint and wallpaper décor business, a beauty shop and the current razor supply business, occupied the first floor;

THEREFORE, the directors of the Lenawee Historical Society do hereby PROCLAIM 124 South Winter Street in Adrian, commonly known as Clark Memorial Hall, as an HISTORIC STRUCTURE in Lenawee County this 8th day of August 2022.
