



WHEREAS, historic structures are not only tangible evidence of important national history, but tell the stories of generations of citizens of Lenawee County and their triumph and tragedies as well; and

WHEREAS, the Lenawee Historical Society created its "Historic Structures" program to identify and celebrate places in Lenawee County, Michigan, that connect people to their individual and collective heritage, and to work toward creating an environment that will support the preservation and rehabilitation of historic buildings and neighborhoods, celebrate economic development of sites, and manage change in communities; and

WHEREAS, 112-114 North Main Street in downtown Adrian is a fine example of a commercial 3-story brick Italianate structure with two separate addresses that dates to 1870; and

WHEREAS, in 1870, Henry Hayden opened a bar and billiard hall on this location followed by a series of offices, food shops, saloons, barbershops; and

WHEREAS, the Val Fox Confectionary Store occupied the site for over fifty years;

THEREFORE, the directors of the Lenawee Historical Society do hereby PROCLAIM 112-114 North Main Street in Adrian, commonly known as both the Hayden Bar and Billiard Hall and the Val Fox Confectionary Store, as an HISTORIC STRUCTURE in Lenawee County this 1st day of November 2020.
