HISTORIC STRUCTURE



817 East Church Street, Adrian

WHEREAS, historic structures are not only tangible evidence of important national history, but tell the stories of generations of citizens of Lenawee County and their triumph and tragedies as well; and

WHEREAS, the Lenawee Historical Society created its “Historic Structures” program to identify and celebrate places in Lenawee County, Michigan, that connect people to their individual and collective heritage, and to work toward creating an environment that will support the preservation and rehabilitation of historic buildings and neighborhoods, celebrate economic development of sites, and manage change in communities; and

WHEREAS, 817 East Church Street is a fine example of classic Queen Anne with a combination of hips and gables in the roof; the front porch is a Craftsman with typical tapering rock face concrete block posts; and dates to 1904; and

WHEREAS, the home was built and originally occupied by Adrian volunteer firefighter George Collar and subsequently occupied by the Walter Krueger family for over 50 years;

THEREFORE, the directors of the Lenawee Historical Society do hereby PROCLAIM 817 East Church Street in Adrian as an HISTORIC STRUCTURE in Lenawee County this 1st day of November 2020.
