



HISTORIC STRUCTURE





325 East Maumee Street, Adrian

WHEREAS, historic structures are not only tangible evidence of important national history, but tell the stories of generations of citizens of Lenawee County and their triumph and tragedies as well; and

WHEREAS, the Lenawee Historical Society created its "Historic Structures" program to identify and celebrate places in Lenawee County, Michigan, that connect people to their individual and collective heritage, and to work toward creating an environment that will support the preservation and rehabilitation of historic buildings and neighborhoods, celebrate economic development of sites, and manage change in communities; and

WHEREAS, 325 East Maumee Street is a fine example of an historic building that began in 1875 as a rectangular structure with plain cornices. It was doubled in size in 1881 with the later addition of a second story of concrete block; and

WHEREAS, Harrison Granite and Marble Works began operating at this site in 1875 until moving to New York in 1900 when the building became a residential apartment house; and

WHEREAS, in 1934 Channing and Mary Nash opened and operated a wallpaper and paint store here for 35 years until Shopkeeper Antiques and Gifts owned by the Von Wahldes opened in 1970 and operated by Glenn Hargrove from about 1986 until 1990; and

WHEREAS, the County Bankruptcy Clinic was located here from 1995 to 2009. Pi Benio opened a private art studio here in 2015 with Legacy Group Retirement Planning sharing an office in the building;

THEREFORE, the directors of the Lenawee Historical Society do hereby PROCLAIM 325 East Maumee Street in Adrian as an HISTORIC STRUCTURE in Lenawee County this 1st day of June 2021.
