HISTORIC STRUCTURE



222 Clinton Street, Adrian

WHEREAS, historic structures are not only tangible evidence of important national history, but tell the stories of generations of citizens of Lenawee County and their triumph and tragedies as well; and

WHEREAS, the Lenawee Historical Society created its “Historic Structures” program to identify and celebrate places in Lenawee County, Michigan, that connect people to their individual and collective heritage, and to work toward creating an environment that will support the preservation and rehabilitation of historic buildings and neighborhoods, celebrate economic development of sites, and manage change in communities; and

WHEREAS, this craftsman style house at 222 Clinton Street was constructed in 1907; and

WHEREAS, Corinthian columns on the front porch reflect the Classical Revival Style; and

WHEREAS, the property on which the house was built is the site of the first county courthouse and jail; and

WHEREAS, the house was built by Dr. G. B. M. Seager and was subsequently occupied by Patsy Hurlbut-Graham for 51 years;

THEREFORE, the directors of the Lenawee Historical Society do hereby PROCLAIM 222 Clinton Street in Adrian, currently the home of James and Laura Doyle, as a HISTORIC STRUCTURE in Lenawee County this 13th day of January 2023.
